

BAI-DAAdministrative Order No. 12 Series of 1992

Subject: CLASSIFICATION OF ANIMAL DISEASES

In order to provide the basis for monitoring, prevention, control and eradication of animal diseases and in the regulation of animals, animal products and by-products, animal feeds, veterinary drugs and products, the following classification of diseases affecting animals is hereby established:

A. FIRST PRIORITY DISEASES — are communicable diseases which have the potential for very serious and rapid spread; are of serious socio-economic or public health consequence; are of major importance in the international trade of animals, animal products and by-products, animal feeds, veterinary drugs and products and; are presently the priority of the government for prevention, control and eradication products.

Foot and Mouth Disease (O₁, A₂₄, C₂) Hemorrhagic Septicemia Authrax Blackleg Hog Cholera Newcastle Disease Rabies

B. SECOND PRIDRITY DISEASES — are communicable diseases which are considered to be of socio-economic and/or public health importance and which are significant in the international trade of animals, animal products and by-products, animal feeds, veterinary drugs and products.
